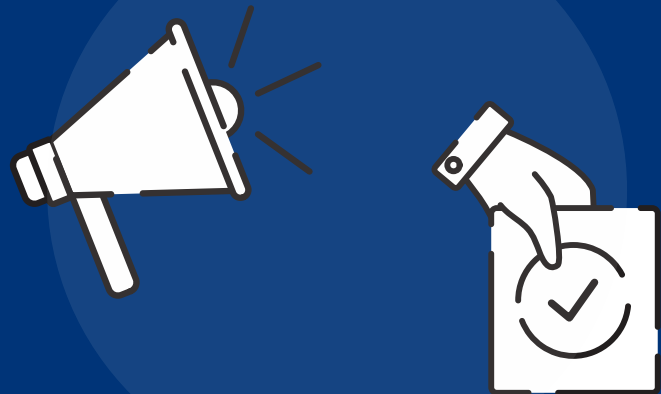
ONTARIO VOTES
