

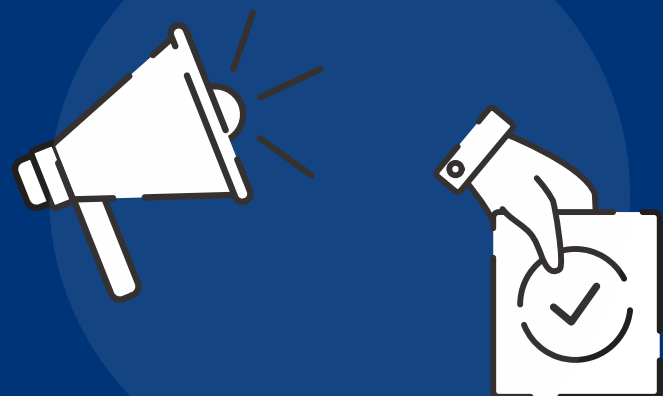

POLICY QUESTIONNAIRE

1. What will your party do to improve timely access to publicly funded mental health services for children and youth?

3. What will your party do to reduce rates of childhood poverty and food insecurity across the province?
4. Will your party commit to expanding sexual and reproductive healthcare, including through universal access to no-cost contraceptives?
