

Northern Health is seeking Pediatricians to join the medical staff in Prince George as permanent members of the department or locums at the University Hospital of Northern British Columbia (UHNBC).

You will be working alongside 8 Pediatricians providing full spectrum inpatient and outpatient general pediatric services. The position involves a full range of Pediatrics as well as trauma team leader (TTL) duties. The successful candidate will have:

- Access to a full complement of specialist services available onsite as well as diagnostic services including both MRI and 2 CT scanners
- The opportunity to participate in medical student and resident teaching with appropriate compensation, and an appointment to the UBC Faculty of Medicine
- Split CTU weeks (approx 7 weeks per year)
- Shared call (Approx 1:7)

UHNBC serves both the immediate population of Prince George (approx. 80,000) and is a referral centre for outlying communities (total population approx. 400,000). It is the main teaching centre for medical students in the Northern Medical Program (NMP) and provides teaching for University of British Columbia residents in several specialties. A Cancer Centre on the hospital site includes both Radiation and Medical Oncology services. The implementation of a new Cardiac Care Unit (CCU) and ongoing development of UHNBC as a future Interventional Cardiac Care Centre makes this an exciting time to join the medical community in Prince George.

Prince George is the center of business, education, health and culture for Northern British Columbia. It is built on the confluence of the Fraser and Nechako rivers. Prince George is the home of the University of Northern British Columbia – Canada's Green University. With an average of 2,000 hours of sunshine per year, you can enjoy the outdoors all year round. Prince George has several live performance venues, a WHL hockey team, a large convention center, a farmers' market, and several fine dining restaurants.
