Unity Health Toronto, St Joseph's Health Centre site in Toronto is inviting applications for an Active Staff full-time position in the Department of Paediatrics, Division of Neonatology. St. Joseph's is a fully accredited community teaching hospital within the Unity Health Toronto network, serving Toronto's west-end.

St. Joseph's provides care to a culturally and economically diverse population of about 530,000. Our hospital is a 400-bed facility that employs approximately 2,500 staff, along with 500 credentialed staff physicians. Unity Health Toronto's values center around Inclusivity, Community, Excellence, Compassion and Human Dignity.

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit is an 18 bed level 2C NICU, with inter-professional neonatal follow-up and antenatal consultation outpatient clinics. The NICU is committed to providing compassionate, family-centered care grounded in evidence-based practice. We foster a collaborative inter-professional environment focused on quality improvement and strong partnerships with tertiary neonatal centres across the region to support the delivery of high quality neonatal care as a valued system partner.

The ideal candidate will have a strong interest in clinical patient care, education, and/or clinical research. The successful candidate must have an aptitude for, and interest in, quality improvement and program development. This individual will join a team that provides 52 weeks of NICU coverage with, currently, of 2 Active Staff neonatologists and 3 Clinical Associate neonatologists, all of whom have University appointments.

The candidate must possess exemplary clinical skills and professionalism, with evidence of excellent interpersonal and collaborative skills. The candidate will be part of a committed team of clinician educators within the Department of Paediatrics and will support teaching of undergraduate and post-graduate trainees.

The successful candidate must be proficient in English and be eligible for an academic appointment at the University of Toronto at the rank of Lecturer or Assistant Professor. Certification in Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or successful completion of a Neonatal-Perinatal Medicine Fellowship Program as well as licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario is a requirement. Candidates must have Canadian Medical Protective Association coverage or equivalent in good standing.

Compensation will be by OHIP billings and by on-call stipend.

The anticipated start date is January 1, 2027 or as mutually agreed upon.
