### Manifestations of colonialism

- Dichotomizes (savage/civilized)
- Dehumanizes
- Normalize/legitimizes discrimination
- Imposes language
- Engrains discriminatory relationships
- Disables resistance/rebuilding
- Deletes resisters from historical narrative



# INDIAN SCHOOLS DEAL OUT DEATH

Startling Rate of Mortality is Shown in Report to the Department

### TWENTY-FIVE PER CENT

Dr. Bryce Shows That Conditions Are Such as to Encourage Disease

indians are cooped up under conditions fatal to them, and Dr. Bryce says he was often "surprised that the results were not even worse than they have been shown statistically to be." He says the conditions demand immediate remedy. What remedy? He has the statistics before him revealing a condition disgraceful to the country, he has visited many of the schools and wonders that the deathrate is not greater than twenty-five per cent, and yet he recommends nothing. His report is printed, many people will scan the title on the cover, some will open it, a few will read it, and so the thing will drift along for another year. And so with the next year, and the year after.

Such will be the course of events—the protests of medical officers buried in blue books and the complaints

of missionaries lost in pigeon-holes—unless public opinion takes the question up and forces it to the front. Then Parliament will show a quick interest, pigeon-holes will give forth their dusty contents, medical officers will have a wealth of suggestions, and the scandalous procession of Indian children to school and on to the cemetery may possibly be stopped.

Between 1989-2017, First Nations children spent over 78 million nights away from their families



### So much child welfare reform and so little change

Most Child Welfare reform measures focused here versus on the causes

**Root Causes** 


First Nations Children 17.2 times more likely to be placed in child welfare care 72% of all First Nations Children in Care are off reserve

Child Welfare reform often codifies government lack of attention to structural risks as child welfare failures



Child welfare system implements child welfare legislation very limited control over structural risks

Statutory Definitions of Child Neglect: parent unable or unwilling to provide necessities of life – **Codifies structural risks as parental failure** 





### Jordan's Principle

- Named after Jordan River Anderson
- Sacred and legal principle
- Access the education, health, and social services supports First Nations children on and off reserve need when they need them
- Need: professional note and guardian's consent
- Call 1-888-JP-CHILD 24 hours a day



#31 "#isitgenocide"? In 2013, hearings at the CDN human rights tribunal began on Canada's failure to fund child welfare equitably and implement Jordan's Principle. This federal government document shows how they treated First Nations and other children differently.

 Federal and provincial policy differ in terms of the length of time a child must wait before being able to apply for new mobility equipment and the number and/or types of mobility devices the government will pay for a particular child.

Service Example: A child with multiple disabilities and /or complex medical needs requires a wheelchair and stroller and requires that a lift and tracking device be installed in his/her family home. The Non-Insured Health Benefits Program (NIHB) will provide children with only one item, once every five years. If the item is a wheelchair, NIHB supports the provision of manual wheelchairs only, which must be fitted with seating inserts in order to accommodate small children. If the item is a ceiling mounted lift and tracking device, funding is not provided by NIHB to install the device in the family home. If these same children were to reside off reserve, they would be eligible to receive more than one mobility devices (if needed) and any installation costs would be borne by the provincial program providing the mobility device.



#28 "#isitgenocide" In 2005, Jordan Anderson died after spending 2+ yrs in hospital unnecessarily as gov'ts argued his care costs b/c he was First Nations. Jordan's Principle is his legacy. In 2011, the feds awarded themselves for never declaring a Jordan's Principle case.

### 2020 CHRT 36: Jordan's Principle off reserve

- Affirms that non status First Nations children resident off reserve who are recognized by their First Nations are eligible for federally funded Jordan's Principle services, products and supports;
- This recognition is **ONLY** for the purposes of Jordan's Principle
- Orders Canada to provide funding to First Nations or First Nations organizations authorized by the First Nation to develop and implement a recognition process;
- Canada appealed 2020 CHRT 36 and the Federal Court dismissed the appeal. Canada did not appeal to the Federal Court of Appeal so the order stands.



# Analysis of ISC Jordan's Principle data (IFSD, 2022):

- Requests increased 625% between 2017 and 2021
- 50% increase between 2019-20
- Only 10% of that increase due to COVID
- Over 50% of requests were for under 5K majority between \$100-999
- Significant Regional Variation Alberta has highest rates of denials (34%)
- Plugging shortfalls in federally funded programs

# ISC: Behaving their way into non-compliance

Canada chose not to implement multiple recommendations and solutions to improve compliance since 2018

Canada did not implement back to basics properly (i.e.: ensuring professional letters).

Canada did not disclose the backlogs until January 2023

Canada did not engage the Jordan's Principle Operations Committee (JPOC), National Advisory Committee (NAC) or Expert Advisory Committee (EAC) to address its non-compliance



### Canada: Rolling back Jordan's Principle

- Over 135K cases in "backlog"
- Cutting categories of service
- Not paying bills in a timely manner
- Unclear funding for Coordinators
- Spewing colonial stereotypes instead of fixing internal management (i.e., mechanizing intake forms)

### Key findings: 2025 CHRT 6

Backlogs inconsistent with previous CHRT orders and must be immediately addressed

Approved cases must be approved in a timely manner to avoid hardship

Urgent case definition can be reviewed but Canada's requested change in timelines was denied

Coordination of federal services

Referrals permissible but no service gaps, long delays or other unforeseen hardships for children

Independent complaints mechanism required



### Jordan's Principle Caring Society Proposals

- Fund gaps in education and health that Jordan's Principle is filling;
- Presumptive approvals for requests under \$500 -\$1000 with a professional letter;
- Improve quality control
- Data collection to track outcomes and compliance.
